Rules for Cruise-Ins



1) General

- a) Boats will be charged a fee set by Delta Yacht Club but no less than **\$65.00 per night**. Please make your **Arrival time not before 10:00 am and departure time is by 10:30 am**.
- b) No camping or overnight sleeping is allowed on the Island.
- c) No explosives, fireworks, firearms or projectile propelling devices (including, but not limited to, pellet guns, BB guns, paintball guns, and slingshots) are permitted on the island or docks.
- d) No bare feet except in pool area.
- e) The Delta Yacht Club Caretaker and his family are entitled to privacy in their home. Please respect it. We request that communication with the caretaker during your stay be through the Commodore or other Delta Yacht Club Host.
- f) If there are any requests or issues they should be directed to the Cruise In Leader and the Delta Yacht Club Host.
- g) All vessels must have an approved and functional sanitation holding tank.

2) Bar Operation

- a) The Delta Yacht Club bar hours of operation are determined by the DYC Cruise-In Host in coordination with the visiting yacht club's cruise-in leader.
- b) **Only alcoholic beverages purchased from the bar are allowed on the Island when the Bar is open.** This is a State of California Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) rule and, if violated, could cause Delta Yacht Club's Liquor License to be revoked or suspended.
- c) A Guest bar punch card (Green Cards) costs \$50 and is good for 16 punches. Half cards (8 punches) can be purchased for \$30. Cocktails, beer and wine, are two punches each. Wine by the bottle sells for 9 punches. A soda card costs \$10 and is good for 10 punches. One can of soda in a red solo cup is two punches.
- d) Bar cards are not refundable but will be honored indefinitely.

3) Pool Rules

- a) The swimming pool is open from Sunrise to Sunset.
- b) No child under age 14 may swim unattended. You are responsible for your own child.
- c) No glass containers are permitted in the enclosed area.
- d) Please do not interfere with the pool sweep or other pool equipment.

4) Pets

- a) Pets must be on a leash whenever they are on the Island. Guests must be in control of their pets at all times and pets must not be left unattended at any time.
- b) Pets are **not** permitted in Island buildings or the pool area at any time and are not allowed on the patio area during the evening hours between 5 pm and 9 pm.

- c) A pet area is provided behind the fence to the right of the pool. Please walk your pet in the pet area only. Please use the bags provided at the pet station for the removal of animal waste from the grass, both in the pet area and if accidents occur elsewhere. Dispose of all animal waste in the receptacle located at the pet station. Do not place anything other than pet waste in the receptacles. ***Please clean up after your own dog . . . always!***

5) Disposal of Garbage

We can accept only house waste (for example, paper plates from dinner). All garbage generated on your boat must be taken with you. There is a separate can for recyclable aluminum containers. There are garbage cans in the galley and behind the barbecue area.

6) Ice Machine

The ice machine is not for cooling refreshments. Please use the refrigerator in the galley.

7) Barbecues

Our barbecues are available for use to all. Charcoal and lighter fluid is available in the barbecue area. Barbecuing is not permitted on boats or docks.

8) Small Boats

Small boats, inflatables, PWCs, etc. (small boats) may not be tied to the outside of the front dock at any time. Small boats should be tied alongside your larger boat on the front dock. If there is room, small boats may be tied to the inside of the front dock but may be moved to accommodate larger vessels.

- 9) **Children's use of the Island.** The Island is an ideal place for children, and we want them to enjoy it fully and safely. Please ensure that they follow these simple rules for their benefit and our peace of mind.

- a) All children under thirteen (13) must wear a life jacket at all times when on the docks. They may leave them at the head of the gangway when ashore.
- b) No running on the docks.
- c) No bare feet, except in the pool area.
- d) No playing in the heads.

10) Fishing is permitted only from the ends of the dock or from your boat.

11) Facilities on the Island

- a) Water on the docks, in the heads and from the faucets on the Delta Yacht Club grounds is not suitable for drinking. Filtered water is available in the galley.
- b) We have a septic tank system that is very sensitive to improper use. Please do not use more paper than is necessary and do not deposit tampons or other foreign objects in the heads.
- c) Do not operate any sprinklers or other valves or switches. Severe damage can result from turning the wrong valve.

12) Vessel Size and Weight Limitations

- a) The maximum length of any style vessel is 65 feet overall. * The maximum gross weight of any style vessel is 80,000 pounds.
- b) A/C Power is limited to 30 AMPS maximum per vessel, regardless of length and weight of the moored vessel. Dual 30 AMP power cords required for a vessel's electrical load center feed, maybe subject to inspection and or review on heavy vessel party attendance dates, to ensure that the maximum 30 AMPS is not abused.
- c) To lessen the electrical load prior to connecting power cable(s) to one of the electrical pedestals on the dock, turn off all circuit breakers on your boat. Starting with your main (shore power) breaker, slowly energize other circuits. Wait a few seconds between circuits, especially circuits with high amperage loads such as refrigerators, air conditioners and water heaters. This will lessen the potential of an electrical current spike when connecting your boat to the island.

13) Use of the Clubhouse

- a) Please wash your dishes and barbecue tools when you are finished and do not leave them in the galley for the afternoon or overnight.
- b) Please leave the galley clean.
- c) Please remove all of your dishes and other possessions from the house when you have finished your meal and clean the tablecloth. Sponges are available in the galley.
- d) Members and guests are requested to wear appropriate attire in the house after 6:00 pm. Please no bathing suits, tank tops, etc.

14) **NO RENTAL BOATS ALLOWED.** This is an insurance and liability issue; therefore, no rental boats will be allowed to tie up to a dock. If a rental boat does tie up to a dock, they will be asked to leave.

15) **Insurance Coverage:** Each guest is responsible for having liability insurance. Proof of insurance must be kept on your boat, as you may be requested to show proof of insurance. It is the responsibility of the Cruise In leader that this provision is adhered to.

16) **Any Delta Yacht Club personal or property damage** caused by a Cruise In member will be the responsibility of the Cruise In member and or the Cruise In Club.

17) **Hold Harmless** -The Cruise In Club will hold Delta Yacht Club harmless for any loss, damage, or injury while the visiting Delta Yacht Club. State and Local health guidelines should be followed with respect to COVID-19.
